Adopted September 9, 2025

Policy Principles

1. We hold **Freedom and Liberty** as our primary values and recognize the supremacy of God, the rule of law and the inalienable rights of Albertans.
2. Our MLAs will represent their constituents first and foremost and will be held accountable through **Recall**.
3. **Taxes** will be collected in Alberta by Albertans and for Albertans.
4. We will create a non-taxable **Alberta Pension Plan**.
5. Albertans will have the right to make their own decisions regarding **Healthcare**.
6. Albertans will have the right to receive an **Education** of their choice.
7. Law and Justice
8. Alberta will recreate and maintain its own **Law Enforcement** with civilian oversight.
9. Alberta will regulate and determine its own **Immigration** policies.
10. We will develop an independent body that protects **Seniors'** rights to live freely and comfortably.
11. Creation of the **Wildrose Economic Advantage** that encourages entrepreneurial spirit and facilitates the creation of wealth in a free market economy.

13. While recognizing historical and current unequal treatment of **Indigenous** peoples we believe in one country, one law for all, and one class of citizenship for all.

The Constitution of Alberta

The Wildrose Loyalty Coalition, as Government, will create “The Constitution of Alberta” with and for all Albertans to uphold the principles ‘that all people are created equal in the eyes of their creator; from that equal creation they derive natural, inherent, self-evident, and inalienable rights, among which are the preservation of life, liberty, property starting one’s own, as well as the pursuit of happiness’; that it is the duty of government to protect and uphold those individual natural rights.

The Alberta Legislative Assembly will always have supremacy over the judiciary, meaning that whatever the Legislature has manifestly done shall not be undone by judicial review that is constitutional.

So conceived, the Alberta Constitution will enshrine, as inviolable, certain individual freedoms, rights, and responsibilities.

1. **We hold freedom and liberty as our primary values and recognize the supremacy of God, the rule of law and the inalienable rights of Albertans.**

- 1.1 Freedom of conscience and religion, including the freedom to practice one’s religion and to live out one’s life in accordance with one’s conscience, beliefs, and convictions that do not infringe on others freedoms.
- 1.2 Freedom of speech, thought, belief, opinion, expression, including freedom of the press and other modes of communication.
- 1.3 Freedom of families, as the moral, social, and cultural pillar of society, to pass on principles, beliefs, values, morals, ethical behavior, accountability, knowledge, and critical thinking to future generations.
- 1.4 Freedom of association and peaceful assembly.
- 1.5 Freedom to own and enjoy property, including the freedom to buy, sell and trade real property.
- 1.6 Freedom of movement within Alberta, including entering and leaving Alberta.
- 1.7 Freedom of self-defence, including the right to use whatever force is necessary to defend life, liberty, and property, as well as the right to own and bear arms.

2. **Our MLAs will represent their Constituents first and foremost and will be held accountable through recall.**

- 2.1 Right to recall any elected representatives including, but not limited to those from provincial, municipal, and school board levels.
- 2.2 MLA’s will NOT be held accountable by a Party Whip.
- 2.3 Citizens will be free to directly express their will, including the right to recall elected representatives, initiate referenda, abrogate unsatisfactory laws, modify the Constitution.
- 2.4 To further democratize the legislature and push authority to its citizens, the position of party whip will not exist, leaving elected representatives to vote freely based on the wishes of their constituents.

3. Taxes will be collected in Alberta by Albertans and for Albertans.

- 3.1 Freedom to transfer an estate without taxation.
- 3.2 Collect all taxes within Alberta, including, but not limited to, personal, corporate, property, and consumption taxes with the goal of reducing taxation.
- 3.3 Constitutionally compelling mandated balanced budgets without raising taxes.
- 3.4 Evaluate mortgage tax deductibility.

4. We will create a non-taxable Alberta Pension Plan.

- 4.1 Develop a new Alberta Pension Plan, and Old Age Security Plan that will reduce premiums and enhance benefits.
- 4.2 Develop new and improved TFSA and RRSP accounts.
- 4.3 Ensure that the Alberta Investment Management Corporation directors will be professionally qualified and remain independent in making decisions free from government or political influence.

5. Albertans will have the right to make their own decisions regarding healthcare.

- 5.1 Children will not be permitted to make irreversible decisions that impact their reproductive health.
- 5.2 Right to access or refuse healthcare of the citizen's choosing, including alternative healthcare.
- 5.3 Assert provincial jurisdictional control over health care, as provided by Canada's current Constitution.
- 5.4 Ensure that all Albertans will retain Alberta Medicare coverage for acute care, chronic care, and mental health care, as well as be able to exercise the choice of purchasing complementary private health care insurance and services to shorten wait times and to improve quality for all Albertans.
- 5.5 Re-establish regional health authorities.
- 5.6 Streamline the number of Alberta Health Services (AHS) managers, administrators, supervisors, directors, as well as coordinators to improve cost and the quality-of-service Delivery.
- 5.7 Permit non-profit organizations and private corporations to own and manage hospitals.
- 5.8 Contract out appropriate elements of the healthcare system competitively, to reduce costs and improve service quality
- 5.9 Use established metrics to compare public and private health care delivery.

- 5.10 Implement technology to reduce wait times to access care, such as provincially based telemedicine.
- 5.11 Replace global funding with funding that follows the patient for medical services to ensure maximal cost efficiency.
- 5.12 Allow physicians to advertise, as well as publish their costs and reviews to inform Consumers.
- 5.13 Negotiate compensation models as well as amounts directly with individual specialist and family practitioner groups.
- 5.14 Provide better access and funding for drug and alcohol rehabilitation.
- 5.15 Fund research strategies to promote individual and public health, as well as prevent sickness and injury.
- 5.16 Remove unnecessary barriers to the recognition and certification of foreign-trained physicians and dentists.
- 5.17 Fully protect the privacy of the individual's medical records
- 5.18 Continuously benchmark healthcare access, quality, and cost with best practices from other jurisdictions, and implement improvements in Alberta accordingly.
- 5.19 Ensure that all diagnostic and therapeutic procedures on minor children are appropriately consented to by a parent or legal guardian, except in acute life-threatening emergencies.
- 5.20 Ensure with documentation that all potential recipients of vaccinations, including parents and guardians, are informed of the potential benefits, as well as all potential risks, and that acceptance or denial of any treatment is a personal choice without recrimination by any authority, including any business or government.
- 5.21 By asserting Alberta's jurisdiction over healthcare, the WLC Government will consider a "right to try" law for promising therapies not yet approved, in desperate medical situations.
- 5.22 Ensure immediate triage of all patients taken to the emergency room.
- 5.23 Quarterly reports will be provided to Albertans of their medical expenses and benefits.

6. Albertans will have the right to receive an Education of their choice.

- 6.1 Parents have the right to choose the kind of education that shall be given to their children, including the content of curriculum, as well as the nature, culture, and character of their children's learning environment, such that laws and government policies, whether fiscal or non-fiscal, fully respect these choices.

- 6.2 Ensure students throughout Alberta are receiving an education where the child is evaluated periodically to maintain a standardized level of education, whether their education takes place in formal schools or home schooling.
- 6.3 IMPLEMENT FREEDOM OF CHOICE IN EDUCATION by ensuring that both equitable funding and the approved Alberta curriculum follows the students for all education options, including public, private, Catholic, and charter schools in Alberta, as well as homeschooling.
- 6.4 Pass a Parent's Bill of Rights to guarantee choice and control over education, including an accounting of scholastic, athletic and other school sponsored extracurricular activities.
- 6.5 Ensure that Alberta Education creates a new curriculum that also responsibly educates students on the merits of Alberta's resources and industries in the context of renewable energy and environmental protection and preservation.
- 6.6 Ensure that Alberta Education create curricula that includes measured learning targets that meet the threshold for scholastic advancement to the next level, not automatic passing.
- 6.7 Ensure that critical thinking and debating skills are part of all curriculums.
- 6.8 Ensure that the curriculum includes exposure to: farming, fishing, hunting, outdoor skills, basic home repairs, vehicle maintenance, and firearms knowledge, i.e., how the real world operates.
- 6.9 Ensure that financial literacy and computer skills are a part of the curriculum from K-12.
- 6.10 Ensure that the curriculum includes exposure to financial skills, including simple accounting, banking, mortgage, investment, as well as money flow to encourage fiscal understanding and economic responsibility.
- 6.11 Ensure that entrepreneurship, business management and self reliance are included in the curriculum.
- 6.12 Ensure that education, athletics, and extracurricular activities occur in a safe Environment.
- 6.13 Ensure that students with special educational needs are identified and, along with the approval of their parents, provided an appropriate curriculum. NOTE: this includes children who either require a more advanced curriculum and less time for learning; and those children who require more time for learning with or without a modified curriculum.
- 6.14 Ensure that teachers educate absent political and or ideological bias, with emphasis on critical thinking and debate.
- 6.15 Ensure that teachers are protected from harassment or discipline for justly giving a student a poor or zero grade.
- 6.16 Ensure that parents are immediately informed of the need for child discipline and are subsequently engaged with implementing a solution for unsatisfactory behaviour.

- 6.17 Encourage all students with the opportunity to get a real-world experience of what drives our economy, feeds our people, and informs them about career opportunities via virtual visits to oil fields, gas plants, ranches, dairy farms, wood mills, medical labs, court rooms, etc.,
- 6.18 Ensure access to educational facilities for all students, including adequate funding for transportation where required in both rural and urban regions.
- 6.19 Ensure that adequate supervision, counseling, and help is available for all students during classroom sessions and school sponsored extracurricular activities.
- 6.20 Ensure that teachers are responsible to their administrators who, in turn, are responsible to their elected school board. who, in turn, are responsible to the parents or legal guardians.
- 6.21 Ensure that teachers remain current with new knowledge and that curricula are upgraded as proven new knowledge becomes evident.
- 6.22 Ensure that teachers can be dismissed who demonstrate a lack of competence or behaviour that is detrimental to students, other teachers, or the profession.
- 6.23 Ensure that teachers who demonstrate a clear effort to improve the learning of their students with the students' best interest clearly in mind are protected from union or political repercussions.
- 6.24 Ban any and all forms of critical race theory or similar for which non-compliance may result in loss of funding, as well as the charter of the institution.
- 6.25 Separate washrooms and change rooms will be provided for both male and females.
- 6.26 Mandate that all post-secondary institutions, in receipt of taxpayer funding, protect freedom of speech, association, as well as peaceful assembly and respect the rule of law; for which non-compliance may result in loss of funding, as well as the charter of the institution.
- 6.27 Respect the right of private educational institutions to practice their own religious and cultural beliefs.
- 6.28 Ensure that Alberta students have priority access and funding if they meet scholastic criteria for admission.
- 6.29 Make student union membership voluntary.
- 6.30 Mandate that the educational systems advancement occurs based on measured performance benchmarked against the best international institutions.

7. Law and Justice

- 7.1 Right of recourse to the courts for citizens whose constitutional rights or freedoms have been violated by a government law, policy, or decision.
- 7.2 Ensure by law that judges do not engage in political campaigning, finance political campaigns, or participate in judicial activism.

- 7.3 We will increase the level of accountability among government officials.
- 7.4 We will work towards reducing repeat offenders through a variety of methods that ensure offenders face consequences and have opportunities to be successfully rehabilitated into society.

8. Alberta will recreate and maintain its own Law Enforcement with civilian oversight.

- 8.1 Create the Alberta Border and Immigration Service to handle border security, customs processing, excise fees, taxes, and fines.
- 8.2 We will ensure the maintenance of an impartial and independent court system, recognizing this as a core function of government by providing additional funds to the court system as necessary, to ensure that undue delay does not derail criminal charges, enforcement, and civil liability court actions.
- 8.3 All successful court challenges against the government shall have lawyer fees covered by the government.
- 8.4 Ensure that the Alberta Human Rights Tribunal is subject to the same criteria for evidence and proof as required by the courts.
- 8.5 Ensure firearm legislation targets criminal behaviour and protects law abiding citizens' right to bear arms. This will be ensured by an appointed Chief Firearms Officer.
- 8.6 Ensure that policing is effectively funded and operates under the dictates of the Alberta Constitution with effective civilian oversight.
- 8.7 Ensure that Alberta's borders are effectively protected.

9. Alberta will regulate and determine its own Immigration policies.

- 9.1 Establish a Ministry of Immigration to control immigration within Alberta.
- 9.2 Require new Albertans to acknowledge that citizenship is a privilege by pledging allegiance to a free Alberta in their citizenship oath.
- 9.3 Require immigrants moving to Alberta to understand their obligation to respect Alberta's value system, Constitution, English language, laws, as well as contribute to strengthening Alberta.
- 9.4 Prioritize citizenship to individuals with current work visas, as well as their families, once they have been resident in Alberta for at least 5 years.
- 9.5 Review Alberta's recognition of the qualifications of migrants to speed up their integration into the workforce, and society at large.
- 9.6 Provide a pathway for skilled workers and professionals immigrating to Alberta to become appropriately accredited for their profession.

- 9.7 Performers, athletes, and others with similar event-based careers will be eligible for a temporary work permit after prepaying applicable taxes and meeting established Criteria.
- 9.8 Illegal immigrants will be deported immediately, or detained at a secure facility pending the processing of an appeal which shall never exceed 90 days.
- 9.9 Alberta will not be a sanctuary province, and birth during visitation will not grant Citizenship.

10. We will develop an independent body that protects Seniors' rights to live freely and comfortably.

- 10.1 Develop a new Alberta Pension Plan, and Old Age Security Plan that will reduce premiums and enhance benefits.
- 10.2 Develop new and improved TFSA and RRSP accounts.
- 10.3 Ensure that the Alberta Investment Management Corporation directors will be professionally qualified and remain independent in making decisions free from government or political influence.

11. Wildrose Economic Advantage

- 11.1 Freedom to create wealth in a free market economy.
- 11.2 Minimize regulations that stifle all business developments.
- 11.3 Encourage businesses and industry to relocate to Alberta through lower taxation as well as a regulatory environment that is conducive to the free market.
- 11.4 Create a competitive tax jurisdiction in North America to inspire the creation, operation, and success of all businesses, which will bring investment, job creation, as well as prosperity in Alberta.
- 11.5 Allow private employer sponsored insurance to compete with Workman's Compensation.
- 11.6 Privatize Alberta's liquor and cannabis distribution system, including online sales.
- 11.7 Enshrine real property and currently non-government owned mineral rights in the Constitution.
- 11.8 Grandfather animal husbandry and agricultural land use to protect landowners, businessmen and farmers from urban encroachment.
- 11.9 Eliminate unnecessary and counter-productive government regulations, taxes, and other barriers to agricultural research, implementation of new technology (pulse fractionation), productivity (processing facilities), marketing, as well as the transport of produce to local and international markets.
- 11.10 Enact right-to-farm and ranch legislation to protect farmers and ranchers from activists, nuisance lawsuits and any other anti-agricultural threats.
- 11.11 Phase out foreign ownership of agriculturally viable land.

- 11.12 Allow farmers to purchase historically approved routine medicines without prescription, which reduces costs without compromising public safety.
- 11.13 Evaluate the adequacy of the agricultural stabilization program for natural disasters.
- 11.14 Facilitate trade via trade missions/trade routes, as well as the enhancement of current and the development of new export markets in all industries.
- 11.15 Consider permitting the sale of produce, eggs, dairy and meat directly to market, without government intrusion, provided proper licensing and safety standards are met.
- 11.16 Ensure that Alberta maintains a healthy bee population, and ensure that municipal regulation of domestic breeds of bees is not an onerous impediment.
- 11.17 Promote an “Alberta First” policy that limits foreign government ownership.
- 11.18 Establish an Alberta Employment Insurance program for residents of Alberta.
- 11.20 Ensure merit-based hiring and promotion practices for government employment.
- 11.21 Unions are prohibited from being third party advertisers.
- 11.22 Use every tool at its disposal to allow pipelines to be built, including legislation to prevent illegal obstruction of pipeline projects.
- 11.23 Allow market forces to determine the development of upgraders.
- 11.24 Promote Alberta as a global center of energy excellence and environmental stewardship.
- 11.25 Permit coal plants to remain operational if they can meet modern emission standards using clean coal emission technology.
- 11.26 Permit the development of industries, such as forestry, mining, and energy, etc., subject to Alberta’s environmental protection standards.
- 11.27 Allow market forces to compete on pricing in the electricity industry that secures uninterrupted supply and smooths demand cycles.
- 11.28 Ensure efficient product safety testing to reduce government imposed overhead Costs.

12. Democracy and Fiscal Responsibility

- 12.1 Ban political lobbying and advocacy by any government-funded entity.
- 12.2 Maintain public access to the Freedom of Information process by eliminating political interference and purposeful delays.
- 12.3 Require annual balanced budgets, subject to unforeseeable natural disasters or acts of war.

- 12.4 Mandate zero based Ministerial budgeting, i.e., All expenses must be justified for each fiscal year period, and every function within the governmental department will be analyzed for its needs and costs.
- 12.5 In the event of a budgetary surplus, prioritize its spending on debt repayment, and tax reduction.
- 12.6 Re-establish the purpose, mission and contributions of the Heritage Trust Fund.
- 12.7 No more than 2% can be withdrawn from the Heritage Trust Fund per calendar year.
- 12.8 Ensure that significant government contracts are publicly tendered with open and transparent bids.
- 12.9 Ensure that organizations and businesses receiving government funds will provide an accounting using International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS).
- 12.10 Ensure that all government expenditures are released in digital format. Absent a legal, security, or proprietary concern.
- 12.11 Legislate a cap on year-over-year increases in government spending to the rate of inflation plus population growth.
- 12.12 Eliminate all corporate bailouts.

13. INDIGENOUS PEOPLE

- 13.1 Given the historic opportunity afforded by the creation of Alberta sovereignty, First Nations people along with all Albertans are invited to participate in the founding of the new independent nation of Alberta, as well as the development of a Constitution of Alberta that is mutually acceptable and beneficial to all; based on the principles that all people are created equal, that they are endowed by natural law with certain inalienable rights, among which are life, liberty, property, and the pursuit of happiness protected by the Constitution of Alberta, and the rule of law.
- 13.2 We believe in one country, one law for all, and one class of citizenship for all.

14. Environmental Protection of Alberta

- 14.1 Improve environmental guidelines to ensure the protection of Alberta's air, land and water.
- 14.2 Ensure that land and water reclamation protocols are considered and that wildlife corridors receive appropriate protection where land is disrupted for the development of natural resources.
- 14.3 Ensure that stakeholders are consulted and/or compensated on the development of Alberta's natural resources.
- 14.4 Communicate our stewardship of the environment to the public and international community.

- 14.5 Re-evaluate the Alberta Government's regulations (Historical Resource Act) of all fossils in Alberta to ensure the effective preservation and cataloguing of our fossil history while encouraging private enterprise involvement, which will create more career opportunities in the historical resource sector.

15. Strong Urban and Rural Communities

- 15.1 Provide funding for emergency shelter for victims of violence.
- 15.2 Institute a new plan to effectively manage the homeless problem based on fully understanding all of the factors that contribute to and perpetuate homelessness, including unnecessary impediments, as well as all potential solutions.
- 15.3 Provide funding with or without social assistance for individuals who are unable to look after themselves and contribute to society from birth, or consequent to life's circumstances, to maintain health, meaning and dignity.
